**ANNUAL ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT OF 2024-2025.**

**Introduction:**

The Department of Industries & Commerce is endeavoring to promote Industrialization in the State through various Industrial and commercial activities including Hospitality and Business Service sector in the State.

The task of the Department is, however, a difficult one. The remoteness of the State along with poor industrial infrastructure like road linkages/ Electricity were the major problems. The second is the special land laws that restrict the transfer of land to non-locals.

The Government of Nagaland and the Industries & Commerce Department is of the view that the State needs infrastructure led growth and therefore stressing more in the development of infrastructure structure in the State. The Department has so far created the following infrastructures in order to facilitate the Industrial growth in the State.

- a) Industrial Growth Centre (IGC) at Ganeshnagar, Dimapur.
- b) Export Promotion Industrial Park which is now being up graded to Product Specific Special Economic Zone (SEZ).
- c) Nagaland Tool Room & Training Centre (NTTC) Dimapur aimed with Human Resource Deployment in the Industrial Sector.
- d) Industrial Infrastructure Development Centre (IIDC) at Kiruphema.
- e) Four Industrial Estates (ID) Mokokchung, Mon, Peren & Dimapur during current plan period.

In order to carry out all such tasks, the following are the structures of the Department:

**A. Administrative set up:** The Commissioner & Secretary to the Government of Nagaland Shri Shanavas C, IAS heads the Administrative Department.

**(a) Directorate:** A Director heads the Directorate, who is assisted by 26 (twenty six) Officers, 4 (four) Inspectors and 144 Ministerial & Grade-IV Staff. A Construction Wing (Housing Div-VI) attached to the Directorate is headed by an Executive Engineer who is assisted by two SDOs, one Divisional Accounts Officer, five Junior Engineers and seven Sectional Officers to look after all civil works under the Department including PSUs under the control of the Department.

**(b) District Industries Centre (DIC):** There are 11 (eleven) full-fledged DICs headed by the General Manager and assisted by Functional Managers & Inspectors and 14 (fourteen) Sub-DICs headed by a Functional Manager and assisted by Inspectors.

**A.India International Trade Fair :-** The Department participated during the India International Trade 2024 at New Delhi from 14<sup>th</sup> to 27<sup>th</sup> November 2024 to represent the Nagaland State. The theme for the 2024 IITF was Viksit Bharat@ 2047. The Department selected 26(twenty six) entrepreneurs for displaying Handloom, Handicraft, Food Products and Dry Flowers. The footfall of the visitors at Nagaland Pavilion was estimated at 3 lakhs approximately. The Exhibition provided opportunity for the participants to display their items and also gave them a platform to interact with the buyers and visitors. They gained a wider and newer perspective on further development of their items.

**B.Hornbill Festival :-** The 25<sup>th</sup> edition of the Hornbill festival commenced with pomp and gaiety at the Naga Heritage Village, Kisama, Kohima with the Governor of Nagaland, La Ganesan as the Chief Host and the Chief Minister of Nagaland, Neiphiu Rio as Host. The newly constructed Handloom & Craft Pavilion was inaugurated by Shri. Neiphiu Rio, Hon'ble Chief Minister of Nagaland, on 29<sup>th</sup> November 2024.

On 1<sup>st</sup> December 2024 at Naga Heritage Village, Kisama, the Advisor for Industries & Commerce Smti. Hekani Jakhalu Kense, Hon'ble MLA & Advisor, Industries & Commerce, Nagaland inaugurated the opening of the "Handloom and Craft Pavilion" This Handloom & Craft Pavilion Marketing Complex serves as a vibrant hub for the celebration, promotion, and marketing of traditional handlooms and crafts.



The Marketing Complex houses 132 stalls across two floors, with 57 stalls on the ground floor and 75 on the first floor. In addition to the stalls, the complex includes a Handloom Museum, administrative offices, a VIP lounge, a conference hall, and a cafeteria. Public amenities, including lavatories for persons with disabilities (PWDs), ensure accessibility for all visitors.

The complex is designed to foster both cultural preservation and economic growth, serving as a dynamic platform where artisans, designers, and buyers can interact. It offers a space where the artistry of traditional handloom and crafts, ranging from textiles to woodcraft and leatherwork, can be admired and purchased. Visitors can find a wide variety of products on display, including traditional shawls, handcrafted furniture, jute crafts, beauty products, local beverages, and horticultural items. The pavilion also features stalls by India Post, local tea producers, and souvenir sellers, offering a unique blend of authentic handmade goods and regional treasures. The total footfall in Handloom & Craft Pavilion Marketing Complex was approximately 1,44,176 nos and with a total sales of Rs.3,13,43,845/- (Rupees three crore thirteen lakh forty three thousand eight hundred forty five only).

The 25<sup>th</sup> Edition of the Hornbill Festival came to a spectacular end with a grand closing ceremony held at the Main Arena in Kisama on 10<sup>th</sup> December, 2024. The event marked the successful conclusion of a 10-day long celebration of Nagaland rich culture and heritage.

The Festival has once again proven to be a vibrant celebration of Naga culture, drawing visitors from across the world to witness the beauty and unity of Nagaland.



**C.Republic Day:** The Department participated during the Republic day celebration on 26<sup>th</sup> January 2025 at Secretariat complex Kohima for exhibition and sale of Citronella oil. Nagaland Women Vocational Training Institute (NWVTI) was also invited to participate for exhibition cum sale of Handloom & Handicraft products.



### 3. FOOD PROCESSING INDUSTRY (FPI):

#### A) CSS – Prime Minister Formalization of Micro Food Processing Enterprises (PMFME) Scheme.

##### a. Credit Link subsidy for new & existing Units:

The status of the entrepreneurs assisted to avail credit-linked subsidy is given below:

- 118 applicants have been sanctioned since 1<sup>st</sup> April, 2024 till date.
- Currently 153 applications are under sanctioning process at the lending banks.
- Altogether, a total of 316 applicants have been sanctioned by the Banks, till date.

##### b. Capacity Building:

- A total of 489 SHG beneficiaries under seed capital money have been trained since 1<sup>st</sup> April, 2024, till date.
- The trainings are conducted in an ongoing basis throughout the year.
- Altogether, a total of 2338 SHGs/entrepreneurs have been trained till date.
- Altogether, a total of 3797 SHG members recommended by NULM and NSRLM were given seed Capital money, till date.

##### c. Mini Tri Food:

- 12 Mini Tri Food projects supported to VDVks, comprising of 4 units under DUDA and 8 units under MARCOFED.

##### d. Common Incubation Centre (CIC):

- An Incubation Centre has been established at School of Agricultural Science (SAS), Medziphema, featuring diverse processing lines like primary processing, dehydration, canning, beverage making, pickle and food testing lab. This centre is set to serve the purposes of incubation, training, and commercial production. Installation of plant and machinery is completed and a trial run of the same is completed.

##### e. Branding & Marketing:

- Proposal for Branding & Marketing project has been approved by State Level Approval Committee, and further submitted to MoFPI, Gol for final approval.

##### f. Activities:

- Participated at the International food event WORLD FOOD INDIA, 2024, held at New Delhi from 19<sup>th</sup> – 22<sup>nd</sup> September, 2024, with local food processors for exhibition cum sale.
- Under the Department, State-wide Stake holder meeting on PMFME Scheme was conducted covering all 16 Districts during the month of May to October, 2024.



The said meeting was convened with the District Administration, DICs, LDMs, Lending banks, Line Departments and relevant entrepreneurs/ organization.

- The Second Edition of the Nagaland Food Connect was organized by the Department under PMFME Scheme at Handloom and Craft Pavilion, Kisama during Hornbill Festival 2024 under the theme- Promoting Foodpreneurs. A total of 24 Food Entrepreneurs took part in the event generating a total revenue of Rs. 44.20/- Lakh.

#### B) Nagaland Food Processing Industries Policy (NFPIP)

The Department have formulated the Nagaland Food Processing Industries Policy (NFPIP), for which approval has been accorded by the Cabinet and is under submission with the NLA.

#### 4. MICRO, SMALL & MEDIUM ENTERPRISES (MSME):

The Micro, Small and Medium Enterprise (MSME) sector is an important pillar of Indian economy as it contributes greatly to the growth of Indian economy with the vast network of around 5.8 Crore Enterprises creating an employment of more than 10 Crores. The department of Industries & Commerce, Nagaland being the facilitator and promoter for the development of Industrial Enterprises of the state has been leveraging the information (Schemes and Benefits) under MSME Sector to promote entrepreneurs and develop enterprises in the state. While keeping in mind the importance of the roles of MSME sectors, the department in collaboration with the MSME-DFO, Dimapur has been proactive in organizing different programmes and disseminating informations received from the Ministry.

#### REGISTRATION OF INDUSTRIAL UNITS

The Government policies on industrial development and extending credit facilities were mainly focused on manufacturing units in the small-scale sector. However, the central Government through an Act of the Parliament introduced a new system bringing about a paradigm shift from tiny/cottage, small scale and Medium Industry to Micro Small and Medium Enterprises (MSME). This new nomenclature of MSME gave a recognition of services and trade sectors. The MSMED Act 2006 marked a shift from SSI (Small Scale Industry) approached to SME (Small and Medium Enterprises) approach. Enterprises are classified as Manufacturing and Service Enterprises based on nature of activity of the Enterprises. Manufacturing and Service Enterprises are further classified into Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises on the basis of investment in plant and Machinery/ Equipment. As per MSMED Act-2006, the investment limits of all categories of enterprises are shown below:

Classification of MSMEs and Procedure for Registration w.e.f 1<sup>st</sup> July, 2020.

#### UDYAM REGISTRATION:

A detail notification on the changes regarding revision of definition of MSME and process of registration has been brought out vide Notification No. S.O.2119 (E) dated 26.06.2020. Apart from the old criteria of categorization of criterion of turnover the differences between manufacturing and services sector have been removed and now both are on the same level of treatment. This new classification and the frame work are expected to bring a new eco-system development of MSME sector in an integrated manner.

The salient features of this notification are as below:

With the Government Notification OM.No. 5/2(1)/2020-P&G/Policy Dated 17.07.2020 Udyog Aadhaar Memorandum (UAM) has been replaced with Udyam Registration.

The Government has developed a system of facilitation for registration of Udyam Process w.e.f. 1.7.2020 as given below:

- An Enterprise for the purpose of this process will be known as Udyam and its registration process will be known as "Udyam Registration".
- The registration portal is [www.udyamregistration.gov.in](http://www.udyamregistration.gov.in)
- MSME registration process is fully online, paperless without any need to upload any document and based on self-declaration. Only Aadhaar number will be enough for the registration.
- After completion of the process of registration, a certificate will be issued online with QR code.
- PAN & GST linked details about investment and turnover of enterprise will be taken automatically from Government Data base.
- No enterprise shall file more than one Udyam registration. However, any number of activities including manufacturing or service or both may be specified or added in one registration.
- Erstwhile EM-II or UAM registration or any other registration issued by any authority under the ministry of MSME, will have to migrate to Udyam registration portal or file Udyam registration afresh.



- There will be no need of renewal of registration. Registration process is totally free.

At present as on January 2025, total MSME Udyam Registration in Nagaland stands at 31098. Dimapur district has the highest registration followed by Kohima district. With the progressive growth of enterprises and ongoing sensitization programme in all the districts for the existing UAM and EM-II registered units to migrate to the new system of Udyam Registration, the registration is expected to grow even more.

### 5. STATE INDUSTRIAL POLICY-2000 (Revised 2004):

#### Introduction:

The State Industrial Policy-2000 was revised in 2004 in order to provide better facilities to entrepreneurs/industrialists for promotion enterprises both in manufacturing and service sectors. Some of the main objectives of the Policy are (i) To create conditions for rapid industrial development and conducive investment climate; (ii) Create gainful employment opportunities for local population; (iii) Develop human resources and bring about improvement in the quality of life by promoting industrial ventures in sectors in which the State has a comparative advantages; (iv) Develop entrepreneurial and other technical skills of the available human resources; (v) Develop industrial infrastructure in selected areas; (vi) Promote Export Oriented Units with a view to exploit the emerging market opportunities in the neighbouring countries; (vii) Provide investor friendly environment by removing procedural bottleneck and legal hurdles; etc. The following are the Incentive Schemes:

- (i) **Power Subsidy:** Subsidy on power tariff @ 30% & 25% given for connected loads upto 1 MW & above 1 MW respectively for a period of 5 yrs. from the date of commercial production subject to a maximum ceiling limit of Rs.2 lakh annually.
- (ii) **Drawal of Power Line:** Cost of drawal of 33/11 KV line to eligible units located outside the notified areas shall be reimbursed for one time only subject to a ceiling of Rs.2 lakh (now as per NEIIPP-2007, anywhere in the State)
- (iii) **Subsidy for Feasibility Study cost:** Subsidy @ 50% of the cost of DPR subject to a ceiling of Rs.1 lakh is eligible for new units with investment in plant & machinery above Rs.25 lakh



(iv) **Manpower Subsidy:** 25% of the actual wage bill for local tribal employees employed by eligible units for 3 yrs. from the date of entertainment subject to a maximum ceiling of Rs.1 lakh annually for those units where the investment in plant & machinery is from Rs.5 lakh to Rs.25 lakh, Rs.2.50 lakh annually for units where the investment in plant & machinery is from Rs.25 lakh to Rs.100 lakh and Rs.5 lakh annually for units where the investment in plant & machinery is above Rs.100 lakh.

(v) **Subsidy for Quality Control measures:** Cost of laboratory equipment for the purpose of quality control and ISI/BIS/ISO 9000 certification is reimbursed subject to a maximum ceiling of Rs.50,000/- in case of small scale and Rs.1 lakh in case of medium & large units.

(vi) **Stamp Duty Exemption:** 50% Stamp duty & Registration fee for securing loans from Financial Institutions including Mortgage of fixed assets are exempted from the Stamp Duty Act for a period of 5 yrs.

(vii) **Stipendiary Support for EDP:** Rs.500/- p.m. per trainee is provided for 100 youths annually for training period not less than 3 months duration.

It may be mentioned here that the Department has already decided to revise the SIP in accordance with the policies and programmes of the State Government and other line Departments of the State as well as the Central Ministries.

## **6. PRIME MINISTER'S EMPLOYMENT GENERATION PROGRAMME (PMEGP):**

### **Analysis of PMEGP loan sanctions under the Department of Industry & Commerce (2016-2025)**

The Prime Minister's Employment Generation Programme (PMEGP) is a credit-linked subsidy scheme launched by the Government of India in year 2008, to generate employment by promoting micro-enterprises in both rural and urban areas. It was introduced by merging the Prime Minister's Rojgar Yojana (PMRY) and the Rural Employment Generation Programme (REGP) and is administered by the Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MoMSME).

With the launch of the online portal for PMEGP in 2016, the process of monitoring, evaluation, and tracking the status of PMEGP loans has become more transparent, efficient, and accessible for users, implementing agencies, and financing institutions, enabling real-time updates, streamlined documentation, and improved coordination among stakeholders.

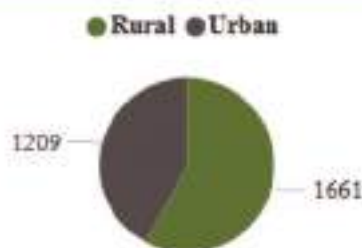

Location of the PMEGP unit



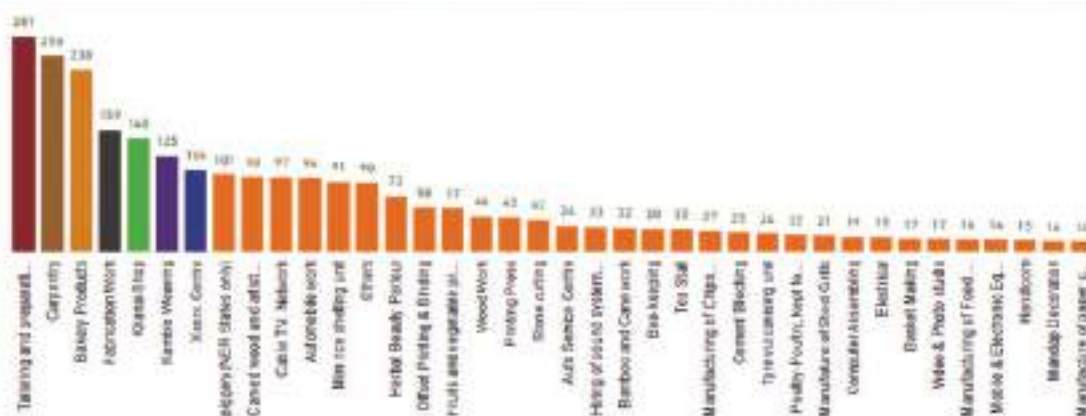
• The Prime Minister's Employment Generation Programme (PMEGP) has been a catalyst for entrepreneurship in Nagaland, empowering individuals to establish small businesses and generate employment opportunities. As of 2025, a total of 2,870 loans have been sanctioned under the Department of Industries and Commerce, fostering self-reliance and economic growth across the state.

• The percentage of women loan sanctions is 42%.

• Male percentage 58%

• In terms of geographic distribution, urban areas have received 1209 loans, whereas rural areas secured 1661 loans, reflecting a strong penetration of the scheme even in remote location.

PMEGP loan sanctions by Industry category



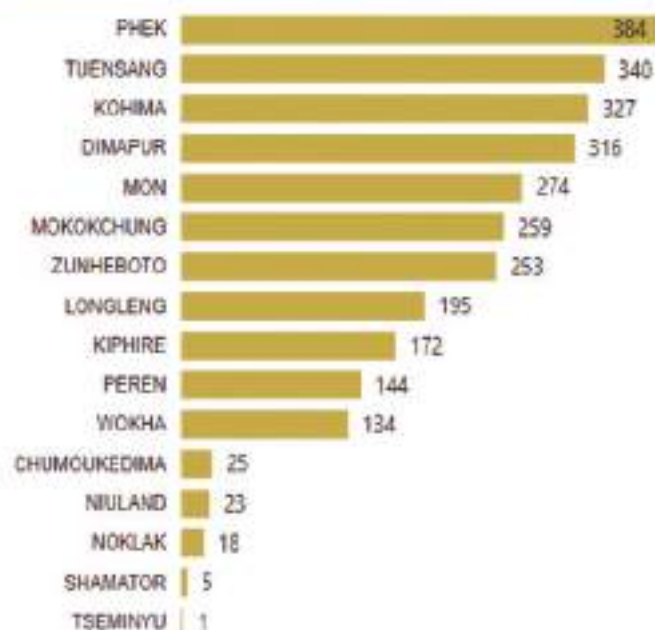


### Industry Preferences and Economic Impact.

The sanctioned loans have primarily supported manufacturing (1,660 loans) and service-based businesses (1,210 loans). Among the top industries benefiting from this financial assistance are:

- Tailoring and garment businesses(281)
- Carpentry(256)
- Bakeries and confectioneries(238)
- Fabrication and metal works(159)
- Bamboo and cane crafts(98)
- Significant increase in Piggery (NE State) in only second year of its introduction.

#### District -Wise analysis of PMEGP loan Sanction (2016-2025)



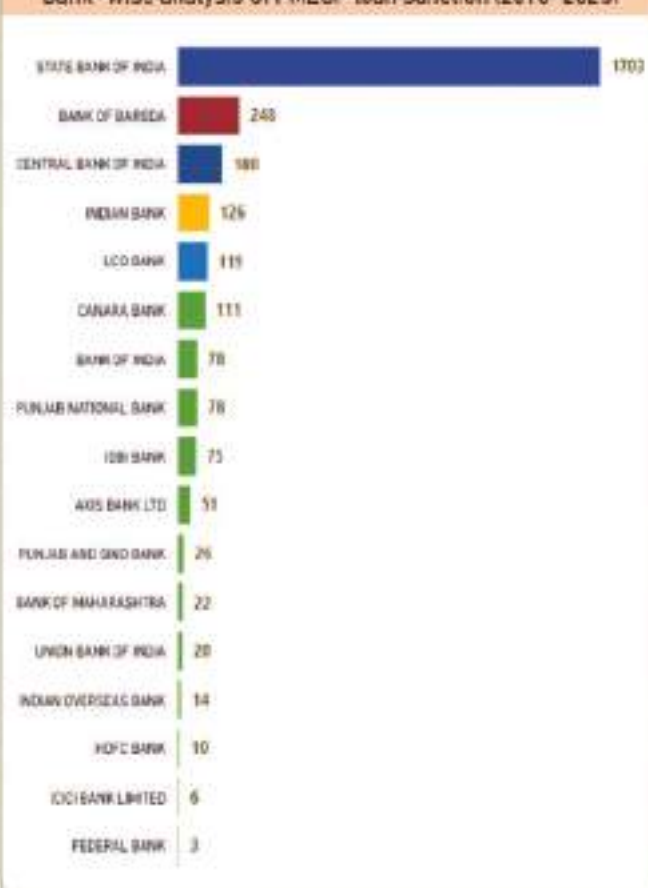
#### District-wise Margin Money/ Subsidy Disbursed/claimed (2016-2025)



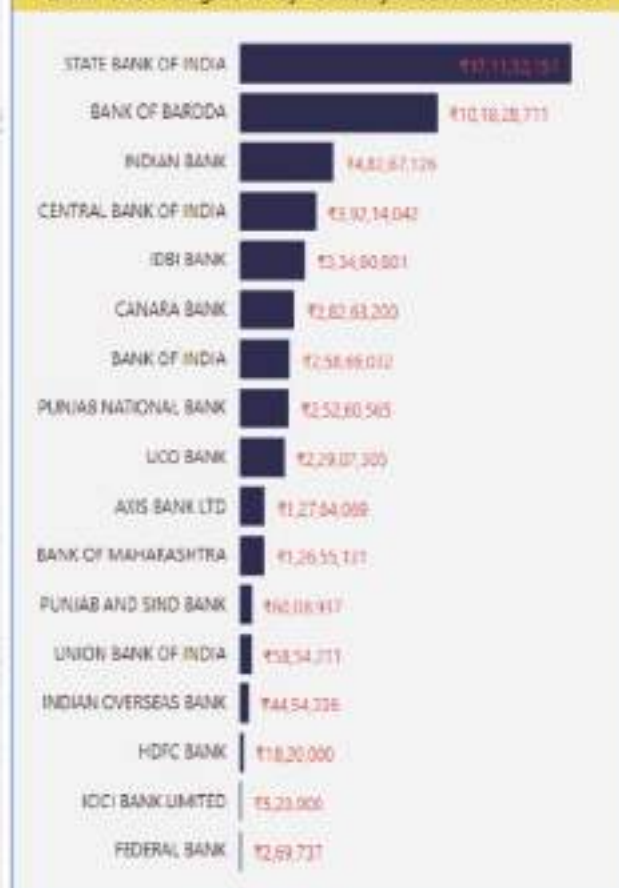
### Bank-Wise Loan Sanctions

The State Bank of India (SBI) has been the dominant financial partner, facilitating 1,703 loans, followed by Bank of Baroda (248 loans) and Central Bank of India (180 loans). With sustained government backing and banking support, the initiative can further strengthen self-employment, innovation, and economic resilience in the state.

### 7. NAGALAND TOOL ROOM & TRAINING CENTRE (NTTC):

Nagaland Tool Room & Training Centre (NTTC), Dimapur (A Govt. of Nagaland Society) has been set up in 2006 by the Industries & Commerce Deptt., Government of Nagaland with financial assistance from the Ministry of MSME, Govt. of India. NTTC, Dimapur is registered with the Govt. of Nagaland vide No. H/RS-3873 dated 02/11/04 under Societies Act 1860. NTTC was inaugurated 9th August 2006. The management of the affairs of the Centre rest with the Governing Council, which is a constituted body appointed by the Governor of Nagaland. The administrative head of the Department of Industries & Commerce, Govt. of Nagaland is the Chairman/Chairperson of the Governing Council body of NTTC. The Director of Industries & Commerce, Govt. of Nagaland is the CEO of the centre. The day-to-day affairs of the centre is looking after by the Principal, NTTC.

NTTC has also conducted various E-SDP courses of six weeks duration in various locations, district headquarters of Nagaland. The courses includes Animal Feed Processing Technology, Fruit & Vegetable Dehydration & Processing, Soap/Detergent/Liquid Disinfectant Making process with organic resources, Banana Fibre Extraction & Handicrafts, Natural Fibre Processing & Handicraft Making, Bamboo Handicraft, Hand-made Paper & Pulp, Dry Flower Making, Solid Waste Management & Waste Plastic Recycling, Waste Management (Reduce, Reuse & Recycle), Concrete Block Making, Sanitary & Plumbing, Sheet Metal Fabrication & Wood Working, House Wiring & Maintenance, Food/Fruit Processing. A total number of about 2800 candidates have availed the training programme.

**c) Crash course on Technical Training:**

NTTC in collaboration with H&A India Pvt. Ltd, Dimapur Branch had conducted one (1) month crash course on technical training in sectors such as welding, plastic moulding, electrical, CNC, and machine operation. A total number of 34 candidates have been trained. Students were learning Japanese language at H&A India Pvt. Ltd, Dimapur Branch for job placement in Japan.

**d) PM Vishwakarma:**

Under the PM Vishwakarma scheme of the Ministry of MSME, Govt. of India, a total of 20 artisans have been successfully trained in Carpenter (Suthar/ Badhai).

**e) Skill Development Training on 'Value Addition to Cereals, Fruits, Vegetables & Spices Processing':**

Under the joint initiative of Central Agricultural University, Imphal, Department of Agricultural Research and Education (DARE), Ministry of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare, Govt. of India,



and Agricultural and Processed Food Products Export Development Authority (APEDA), Ministry of Commerce & Industry, Govt. of India, a five-day skill development programme on "Value Addition to Cereals, Fruits, Vegetables & Spices Processing" was conducted at Nagaland Tool Room & Training Centre, Dimapur from 23rd to 27th September 2024. **3. Internship Programmes for Undergraduate Students Under NEP 2020:**

As part of New Education Policy 2020, undergraduate students from various colleges in and around Dimapur, Chümoukedima and Kohima districts are undergoing their internship training programmes on various trades viz food processing, information technology (Graphics & Video Editing and Print Media), electrical (house wiring), welding, carpentry at NTTC to provide students with practical experience and skills that can help them in their future careers. The duration of the programme is 60 hours/10 days. A total number of about 250 students have availed the programme.

4. The innovation programme on "Stimulating Innovation" was organized by Nagaland Tool Room & Training Centre (NTTC) under the initiative of Start-up Nagaland.



This programme was conducted in Mon district on 5<sup>th</sup> June 2024 and Longleng district on 7<sup>th</sup> June 2024, focusing onto raise awareness about the Start-up Nagaland initiative, enhancing the students' ability to identify problems and develop problem-solving skills. This innovation programme was a significant step towards fostering a culture of innovation and entrepreneurship among the students.

**5. Setting up of Centre of Excellence-Skill Centre (Advance Simulation and Incubation Centre) at NTTC, Dimapur under CSR Programme of Bharat Forge Limited, Pune:**

NTTC, Dimapur under the CSR Programme of Bharat Forge Limited (BFL), Pune is establishing a Centre of Excellence-Skill Centre (Advance Simulation and Incubation Centre) at NTTC, Dimapur as a new age technology hub for Nagaland state and NE Region. The Centre of Excellence focus on CNC Simulation, Robotics, Data Analytics and Electronics to align with modern industry practices which will significantly contribute towards technological training and advancement in the NE Region. The Centre of Excellence has the potential to provide industry with cutting-edge simulation technologies, improve competitiveness, productivity, and drive innovation and entrepreneurship leading to the creation of new businesses and jobs. It will foster collaboration between industry, academia, and government leading to new research partnerships and innovations. The Centre of Excellence will also provide training and capacity-building opportunities to youth, developing the skills and expertise of youth, entrepreneurs etc.

**6. Setting up of Agro-Based Rural Technology & Incubation Centre:**

NTTC has set up Agro-Based Rural Technology & Incubation Centre under the Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSME), Govt. of India. Good number of appropriate rural technology, improvised agro based machineries including rural technologies such as

#### **7. Modernization/Upgradation of NTTC:**

Under the scheme 'Promotion of MSMEs in NE Region & Sikkim' (A scheme of MSME, Govt. of India), NTTC has been modernized and equipped with state-of-the-art technologies both conventional and non-conventional machineries having proper infrastructural facilities, accessible with modern stage of technological development to support the growth of the SMEs ensuring judicious economic exploitation of the rich available natural resources for socio-economic development of the society. The construction for administrative building, classrooms, and workshops has been completed including IT Lab has been set-up and occupied. Various capacity building and skills development training programmes and other manufacturing job-works were being carried out since then.

#### **8. Setting up of Extension Centre of NTTC at Kiphire:**

The project 'Extension Centre of NTTC, Dimapur' at Kiphire Town under the scheme "Promotion of MSMEs in NER & Sikkim" Ministry of MSME, Govt. of India is progressing towards its establishment. This project is to facilitate conduct of various skilling and entrepreneurial development programmes for the youth besides judiciously exploiting and harnessing natural resources, develop agro-based rural technology, extend support services for creation of enterprises, sustainable livelihood opportunities, etc. The Extension Centre is towards its establishment and expected to be over by March/April 2025.

#### **9. Construction of Hostel under AICTE Scheme 'Campus Accommodation & Facilities Enhancing Social Experience (CAFES)':**

The construction of hostel building with gym equipment, indoor sports and facility for competitive exams/higher education at NTTC, Dimapur under AICTE Scheme 'Campus Accommodation & Facilities Enhancing Social Experience (CAFES)'-NER is towards its establishment and expected to be over by March/April 2025.

#### **10. Setting up of Entrepreneurship Development Centre at NTTC, Dimapur:**

To support and facilitate entrepreneurs/innovators, NTTC has set up Entrepreneurship Development Centre sponsored by North Eastern Council (NEC), Shillong and implemented by Indian Institute of Entrepreneurship (IIE), Guwahati the Nodal Agency whereby about 150 entrepreneurs/Innovators/MSMEs have been assisted during 2024-25 in job works and services.



**8. NAGALAND KHADI & VILLAGE INDUSTRIES BOARD, (NKVIB) KOHIMA:**

The Nagaland Khadi & Village Industries Board is a statutory body constituted by the Government of Nagaland under the Act – (No. 5 of 1978) of Nagaland Legislative Assembly and it started functioning in January 1979. The main function of the Board is to implement the programmes in accordance with the Khadi & Village Industries Commission (KVIC) pattern of assistance from time to time. Thus, the NKVIB is not a profit making organization of its own but to implement the programmes and scheme of KVIC by providing assistance in the form of marginal grant to the beneficiaries/units financed by the banking agencies under PMEGP scheme to promote Khadi & V.I. activities in the State.

As per the provision of the Act, under Chapter V Clause – 25(i) "... the establishment expenditure of the State Board will be the sole responsibility of the State Government. Similarly it may grant subvention compensation irrecoverable debts."

**2) KHADI BHAVAN.**

The Board has Khadi Bhavan at Super Market complex, Dimapur for selling the trainees products of the training centre and also the rural artisan entrepreneur products of khadi & village industries.

**3) EDP TRAINING TO PMEGP BENEFICIARIES:-**

The beneficiaries financed under PMEGP Scheme are compulsory to undergo 2 weeks EDP Training in the designated Institutions of KVIC. The Khadi & Village Industries Commission had placed entire Training budget allocation for the year 2024-25 to State KVIC Office, Dimapur to conduct EDP Training in the State of Nagaland for those unit financed by financing agency (Bank) under Margin Money Scheme (PMEGP). The KVIC has assigned NKVIB through MDTC Dimapur to conduct EDP Training for PMEGP beneficiaries. Accordingly, during the current year MDTC has conducted EDP training for 171 PMEGP beneficiaries. It may also be stated that the MSME has introduced the online EDP training module which the beneficiaries are now availing the facility.



**CAPACITY BUILDING:**

a) The Multi-Disciplinary Training Center at Nagarjan Dimapur has conducted various village Industries training programme under the purview of KVIC year wise budgetary allocation. **5. Khadi Plaza (Haat):**

The KVIC has agreed in principle for establishment of a Khadi Plaza (Haat) at Dimapur, where the expenditure will be met by the KVIC and the State Government on the basis of 90:10 ratios in a phased manner. The KVIC and the State Govt. have jointly laid the foundation stone at Agri Expo Site, 4th mile, Dimapur on 23rd February 2010 by the Hon'ble Chief Minister, Nagaland in presence of Hon'ble Chairperson, KVIC and other Govt. and KVIC officials.

The KVIC has sanctioned Rs. 6.18 crore for the construction of 1st phase including the State share amounting to Rs. 61,80,000/- and released Rs. 5.56 crore. State Government has released its share of 10% of the total project cost as seed money. The Board has released Rs. 6,17,80,000/- to the contractor basing on the work completion certificate and bill submitted by the technical agency i.e. Engineer wing, Directorate of Industries and Commerce Department.

The State Govt. has earmarked Rs. 4.95 crore to complete the 2nd-phase construction under re-financing agency – HUDCO. The construction of the 2<sup>nd</sup> phase is undergoing by availing the 1st installment from HUDCO.

The Secretary, MSME and officials from Delhi visited the Khadi Plaza construction site at 4<sup>th</sup> Mile, Dimapur on 04-12-2021 and assure to provide the fund for completion of this project.

**6. LBI under ASPIRE Scheme from MSME**

The MoMSME has approved LBI under ASPIRE scheme at MDTC Dimapur for an amount of ₹ 1.00 crore and release ₹ 0.50 crore for purchasing machineries and equipment. Accordingly, the machineries and equipment has been procured and undergoing installations at MDTC Dimapur. 2nd installment of ₹ 0.50 crore yet to receive from MSME.

The Nagaland Hotels and Tourism Development Corporation Limited with its 2 (two) Subsidiary units in operation i.e Hotel Japfu, Kohima and Hotel Saramati, Dimapur with well-managed ambience of three star category facilities have been providing services to both international and domestic clients. Both the hotels are registered members of the Federation of Hotels and Restaurant Association of India (FHRAI) and the Hotels and Restaurant Association of Eastern India (HRAEI).

The State Government appoints the Chairman of the Board of Directors.

The Managing Director is responsible for the affairs of the Corporation. An Officer on Special Duty (OSD) is also deputed from the Department of Industries & Commerce. The Nagaland Hotels and Tourism Development Corporation Limited Head Office has 1 (one) General Manager assisted by subordinates Officers and Staff to oversee the day to day management of the Corporation.

## 10. NAGALAND HANDLOOM & HANDICRAFTS DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION LTD. (NHHDC).

### BACKGROUND OF NHHDC LTD. :

The Nagaland Handloom & Handicrafts Development Corporation Ltd. was set up in the year 1979 as a Government of Nagaland Undertaking with the main objective of promoting and developing the vibrant traditional Handloom & Handicrafts products, Indigenous and unique to the state of Nagaland. The Corporation has its Head office at Half Nagarjan, Dimapur, Nagaland and has 7 (seven) Sales Emporium within and outside the State. The Corporation also has a production center at its Head Office Complex where it produces both Handloom & Handicrafts products to be sold through its Emporiums. The Corporation also distributes raw materials to registered groups of Artisans/Weavers to enhance the production on a fixed rate basis as well as procure finished goods from the registered members for sale through its own outlets i.e., Emporiums. Further, various Exhibitions, Fairs and Crafts Bazaars within and outside the state are regularly carried out to provide a platform to our artisans/weavers for promotion of their products and also to educate them about the intricacies of the marketing world.

### ADMINISTRATIVE SET- UP :

The Corporation functions as a Company with a Board of Directors chaired by the Chairman, nominated by the Government of Nagaland. The executive set-up is managerial and is headed by a Managing Director. At present there are 7 units i.e., Finance, Marketing, Development, Administration, Store, Recovery and Project which looks after the entire gamut of the Corporation's activities.

### Activities of the NHHDC during 2024 -2025

#### 1.State Handloom Expo:

For the financial year 2024-2025, the Office of the Development Commissioner (Handlooms), Ministry of Textiles, Govt.of India, New Delhi sanctioned 3 (three) Nos. of State Handloom Expo.



2 (two) nos to be organized at Urban Haat, dimapur and 1 (one) no at Handloom Haat, Janpath, New Delhi. 1 No State Handloom expo has already been conducted at Urban Haat, Dimapur from 4<sup>th</sup> – 17<sup>th</sup> December, 2024. Another State Handloom Expo is scheduled from 6<sup>th</sup> – 19<sup>th</sup> February, 2025 at Handloom Haat, Janpath, New Delhi and another from 6<sup>th</sup> – 19<sup>th</sup> March, 2025 at Urban Haat, Dimapur, respectively.

#### **PRODUCTION ACTIVITIES:**

Production of Handloom & Handicrafts activities being of its prime objectives, the Corporation invested an amount of Rs.12.86 lakhs only for procurement of raw materials for production at its Weaving Production Center, Dyeing Center and Craft Development Center and the total value of Production from the above centers amounts to Rs. 24.96 lakhs. There are about Rs. 6.18 lakhs value of raw materials unused in the store.

#### **MARKETING AND PROMOTIONAL ACTIVITIES:**

Finished products of the Corporation as well as those from its production units within the State are marketed through the sales outlet of the Corporation within and outside the State. The Corporation has invested an amount of Rs.36.08 lakhs for procurement of Handloom & Handicrafts finished products from the registered production units and has achieved total sales amounting to Rs. 41.32 lakhs during the financial year 2024-2025 (till January 2025).

#### **MARKETING SOURCES & TARGET:**

The Nagaland Handloom & Handicrafts Development Corporation Ltd. is the only establishment in the state obligated for development and promotion of rich, traditional and modern designed handloom & handicrafts of Nagaland. Survey reveals that it has the viability across the country to penetrate into the national market. These days, since online shopping is gaining momentum, the Corporation has started marketing out its products online through Instagram and Facebook page with the brand name 'MERAKI' besides outsourcing its products to private owned outlets.

#### **CONCLUSION:**

With the abundant availability of skill and resources, the Handloom & Handicrafts sector has the potential to grow and contribute positively to the economy of the State. More importantly, the development of this sector would directly influence the income and standard of life of weavers and artisans in the rural areas which in turn would account for economic and social development in the rural areas, so that almost every household in the villages of the State can boast of having skilled weavers and craftsmen. The Corporation, while recognizing this tremendous potential is also working towards creating awareness about this sector through its various activities such exhibitions, trainings, seminars, etc.

In view of the above stated facts, the Government is requested to assist the Corporation in all possible manners so as to enable the NHHDC Ltd. to achieve its objectives fully.



## **11. NAGALAND INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION LTD. (NIDC):**

Nagaland Industrial Development Corporation (NIDC) has been committed to fostering industrial growth and economic development in the state. The year 2024-2025 was marked by significant progress in financial performance, project implementation, and policy initiatives aimed at promoting entrepreneurship and industrialization. The activities of the period are as mentioned below:

### **LOAN OPERATIONS**

NIDC, in addition to its own schemes, is the State Channelizing Agency (SCA) for various Central Refinance Schemes and has been availing refinance from these agencies. The following are the Schemes which NIDC has channelized and for which the ongoing recovery efforts have increased in the year 2024-2025.

### **BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT**

NIDC manages two Industrial Estates in Dimapur with a total area measuring 30 acres with ready built Standard factory sheds and plots which are being allotted and leased out to entrepreneurs at subsidized rates. The revenue earnings from these leased units have also increased over the past year with revision in rental rates with almost 100% occupancy rate.

Additionally NIDC also manages a Multi sectors SEZ in Ganeshnagar that offers a perfect blend of industrial, business and social infrastructure such as:

- a) Housing blocks
- b) Developed plots
- c) Standard Design Factories
- d) Industrial Sheds
- e) 10MW Electrical Sub station
- f) 2,00,000 litres WTP

There have been ongoing processes for potential Export Oriented Units (EOU) in the year 2024-25 to be set up at the Multi Sector SEZ which are still ongoing.

NIDC also owns and manages a residential complex at Supermarket area, Dimapur which provides low cost residential accommodation facilities for lower income sections of the society, consisting of 36 residential flats categorized into Middle Income Group (MIG), Lower Income Group (LIG) and Economically Weak Section (EWS) flats.



Besides exploring various avenues for business expansion, NIDC has been made the State Implementing Agency for the following schemes under different Central Ministries of Govt. Projects being implemented in the year 2024-25 are as follows:

## **12. EASE OF DOING BUSINESS (EODB) & ONE DISTRICT ONE PRODUCT (ODOP):**

### **Ease of Doing Business (EoDB), Reducing Compliance Burden (RCB) & CoR:**

Under EoDB, the exercise on Business Reforms Action Plan (BRAP) 2024 commenced in April-May 2024. Initially, the total reform action points in Part B to be implemented by the States/UTs stood at 287. The introduction of BRAP+ and RCB+ expanded the scope of the exercise and the total number of reforms increased to 435. Evidence collection, creation and uploading in the BRAP portal to continue till February 15, 2024. Target set for the current cycle is 35-40%.

Under minimizing regulatory compliance burden (RCB) exercise, the team concentrated on identification of compliances from the list of 23 Acts (shared by DPIIT) across 11 departments. A total of 346 compliances have been identified from 19 Acts across 8 departments. Data of more than 90 burdensome compliances have been uploaded and are currently in under review stage. Work still in progress.

Measuring Cost of Regulation (CoR) is a nationwide survey that aims to capture the administrative cost burden borne by businesses for availing services from government departments. DPIIT shared a list of 13 specified services on which States/UTs were asked to provide user data for the period viz, 1st April 2023 - 15th Dec 2024. Till date, user data on Environment Clearance, Fire NOC, Registration under Labour Deptt & Electricity connection as received from respective department submitted to DPIIT. Exercise is ongoing.

### C. Handloom Weavers' Welfare

**PRADHAN MANTRI JEEVAN JYOTI BIMA YOJANA** - PMJJBY is an insurance scheme offering life insurance cover for death, due to any reason. The life cover is for a year from 1<sup>st</sup> June to 31<sup>st</sup> May and is renewable on year to year basis

All handloom weavers/workers in the age group of 18-50 years will be eligible and an amount of Rs.2.00 lakh will be payable on beneficiary's death due to any cause, for one year insurance coverage period from 1<sup>st</sup> June to 31<sup>st</sup> May.

**PRADHAN MANTRI SURAKSHA BIMA YOJANA** - PMSBY is an insurance scheme offering accidental insurance cover for death or disability. This cover is for a year from 1<sup>st</sup> June to 31<sup>st</sup> May and is renewable on year to year basis. All handloom weavers/workers in the age group of 18-70 years will be eligible for benefits as below.

- \* Accidental Death - Rs.2,00,000/-
- \* Permanent Total Disability - Rs.2,00,000/-
- \* Permanent Partial Disability - Rs.1,00,000/-

Number of handloom weavers/workers under PMJJBY, PMSBY is 2860 weavers for which the annual premium amount to be covered by Govt. of India and Govt. of Nagaland.

### D. Small Cluster Development Programme (SCDP)

Small Cluster Development Programme under NHDP funded by Development Commissioner (Handlooms), Ministry of Textiles, Govt. of India is an initiative that provides financial assistance and support to handloom weavers located in a specific geographical area, aiming to improve their production capabilities, market access, and overall economic conditions by focusing on collective development within that cluster; essentially, it's a targeted program to uplift smaller handloom communities with specific needs, as opposed to larger, established clusters.

Interventions include Baseline Survey, Diagnostic Study, Formation of Consortium, Awareness Programmes, Product Development, Exposure visit, participation in exhibitions/B-SMs/publicity, Documentation of cluster activities, Engagement of Textiles Designer, wage compensation to the trainees for skill up-gradation, incentive to IA etc. Interventions benefitting directly individual weavers like providing Looms & accessories, lighting units, Worksheds are provided under the programme.

An amount of Rs. 291.64 lakh is approved during 2024-2025 to set up Small Cluster Development Programme for Handloom weavers in Dimapur and Ungma with 386 weaver beneficiaries

**E. Construction of Individual worksheds for weavers of Other than Assisted Clusters under NHDP** funded by Development Commissioner (Handlooms), Ministry of Textiles, Govt. of India.

An amount of Rs.184.80 lakh is approved and sanctioned during 2024-2025 for construction of individual worksheds for weavers in areas having individual weavers who are outside the fold of any clusters assisted programme funded under NHDP for 154 weaver beneficiaries

## 17. ECONOMIC PLANT (EP):

Citronella oil is extracted from the grass and stems of *Cymbopogon winterianus* through Steam Distillation method. This fragrant grass got its name from the French word meaning "Lemon balm", due to its floral, citrus like aroma. Citronella oil is extensively used for a variety of purposes such as an insect repellent, anti-fungal agent, anti-bacterial, analgesic, anti-inflammatory, to treat parasitic infections, to promote wound healing, to lift mood or fight fatigue, in perfumes or as flavor additive in foods.

At present, there are 10 Economic Plant farms in the state namely:

1. Training-Cum-Production Centre, Sirhima.
2. Mongsenyimti Farm under District Industries Centre, Mokokchung.
3. Kubolong Farm under District Industries Centre, Mokokchung.
4. Tsuremmen Farm under District Industries Centre, Mokokchung.
5. Liroyimti Farm under District Industries Centre, Mokokchung.
6. Chingmei Farm under District Industries Centre, Tuensang.
7. Yongnyah Farm under District Industries Centre, Longleng.
8. Leangyu Farm under District Industries Centre, Mon.
9. Chukitong Farm under District Industries Centre, Wokha.
10. Losami Farm under Sub-District Industries Centre, Phek.

However, during the current Financial Year 2024-2025, 4 Farms did not make any production due to wear and tear of distillation machines. Altogether 227.5 litres of citronella oil and 26 litres of lemon grass oil were produced during 2024-2025 and its market value is approximately estimated around Rs. 3,77,000 (three lakhs seventy seven thousand) only.
